Day Camp Descriptions

BASKETBALL

AM-4DAYS **Week 2** **\$40**

Grades 2-5. This camp will focus on basketball fundamentals: shooting, dribbling, passing, and some defense as well as rules and terms of the game. Campers should wear gym clothes and bring clean tennis shoes to wear on the Lister-Sage gym floor.

CATCH THE WAVE TO PreK-K

AM-4DAYS **Week 3** **\$40**

Grades PK-K. This camp is designed for pre-

school/kindergarten children ages 3 and up who are toilet-trained and have not yet attended Kindergarten. The theme for the week—Catch the Wave will help the campers discover how much fun the ocean and beach can be while reinforcing social, cognitive, and fine motor skills. This camp is a great introduction to the preschool environment.

CHIMING IN 1

AM-4DAYS **Week 2** **\$40**

Grades 4-6. The participants will learn to use and play hand-chimes, read notes, and play with a group. A knowledge of note reading is not required. Campers will meet at the school and walk down the hill to the Methodist Church. All supplies and equipment will be provided.

CHIMING IN 2

AM-4DAYS **Week 1** **\$40**

Grades 6-12. The participants will learn to apply note reading to playing hand-chimes. A knowledge of note reading is required. Campers will meet at the school and walk down the hill to the Methodist Church. All supplies and equipment will be provided.

COOKING IT UP

PM-4DAYS **Week 2** **\$40**

Grades 2-5. This week will focus on basic nutrition and food preparation. Participants will put together a set of recipes for nutritious snacks that they can prepare for themselves. The week will be spent practicing the recipes so they can share them with their families at home. All supplies and equipment will be provided.

ELECTRICAL OPERATION**PM-1DAY****Week 3****\$10**

Grades 7-12. This camp is offered on June 21 only from 12:30 to 4pm. A fun worthwhile 1/2 day camp offering participants the opportunity to learn something about the rural electric utility. This camp will offer an electrical safety demonstration, an actual pole climbing using climbing belts, hooks and hard hat, and exposure to working with rubber gloves/sleeves, hot sticks and extendo's. The camp will also feature digger derrick truck demonstration and rides. This is an outdoor camp—please wear appropriate clothing for weather conditions and comfortable shoes—no flip-flops. Participants will meet at the school and be transported to Northwest Rural Headquarters approximately 1/2 mile south of Hay Springs.

FIESTA GRANDE**AM-4DAYS****Week 1****\$40**

Grades 2-5. Campers will have the opportunity to taste some traditional Mexican foods, play games, hear music unique to the culture, learn about everyday life, as well as have a great time learning basic conversational Spanish language. All supplies and equipment will be provided.

FIESTA POCO**AM-4DAYS****Week 2****\$40**

Grades PK-1. Little campers will learn basic Spanish language; colors, counting, animals, and common foods. These campers will also have the opportunity to experience food, music, and games that are part of the Spanish culture. All supplies and equipment will be provided.

GREEN TO RED: LIVESTOCK PRODUCTION**AM-4DAYS****Week 4****\$40**

Grades 3-12. This camp will expose youth to the science and art of rangeland management as it pertains to livestock production. The focus is on items involved in livestock production. Campers will learn how our forages grow (green) and how to best use them in livestock production (red). We'll spend most of our time outdoors with hands-on learning sessions in plant identification, forage quality, land use and beef cattle body condition scoring. We'll also look at and taste the newest beef value added cuts (can you say grilling!) and talk about bio-security and animal welfare. Though this camp focuses on beef cattle production, as much as possible we'll also talk about two other ruminant animals found in the northern Panhandle region: meat goats and sheep. Campers should wear closed toe shoes and long pants as we'll be going outdoors and walking around quite a bit. Campers will be transported to various field sites through the camp. Campers should bring a jacket, sunscreen, and a water bottle.

GRILLING IT UP**PM-4DAYS****Week 4****\$40**

Grades 5-12. This camp will focus on how kids can get in on the grilling action. Participants will learn the proper food handling procedures for items to be grilled. They will also learn how to use grilling equipment with proper adult supervision. These young grillers will prepare several recipes including several main dishes, side dishes and desserts. All supplies and equipment will be provided.

HAY SPRINGS HISTORY

AM-4DAYS **Week 2** **\$40**

Grades 3-8. This camp will consist of 4 days of exploration of Hay Springs and the surrounding area. Both Hay Springs museums will be toured as well as trips to Camp Sheridan, Spotted Tail Agency, and the Old Jules homestead. If students wish, Friday morning will be spent helping Cindy Peters produce an article that conveys the campers' experiences for the Hay Springs Hip-Hop newspaper that she publishes. Campers need to be sure to bring comfortable walking shoes—no flip-flops, sunscreen, jacket, and water bottle.

MOVIN' & GROOVIN'

AM-4DAYS **Week 1** **\$40**

Grades PK-1. Young campers will have the opportunity to sing & dance; exercise and play games; listen to stories; explore their creativity through the art center and free play; and of course—recess on the playground! Campers need to be sure to wear comfortable walking shoes—no flip-flops, and bring sunscreen, jacket, and water bottle.

NASA LEGO

AM-4DAYS **Week 1** **\$40**

Grades 3-8. Science is out of this world—literally! Join the crew of the International Space Station as they use the scientific method to investigate the effects of microgravity on simple machines. Campers will work in pairs to build simple machines using Legos®. All supplies and equipment will be provided.

NATURAL RESOURCES

AM-4DAYS **Week 4** **\$40**

Grades 3-8. This camp will provide a well-rounded

introduction to natural resources. Each day a local agency will be working to better participants understanding of: water, waste/recycling, wildlife, soil, and foliage. All supplies and equipment will be provided.

OUTDOOR SKILLS

AM-4DAYS **Week 4** **\$40**

Grades 2-6. This camp will be held on Friday, June 29th from 8:30 until 4:00 pm. Come experience the wonders of the great outdoors! We will be learning and doing activities related to wildlife identification, habitat, survival instincts, camouflage, hiking and insects. Campers should wear long pants, closed toed shoes and bring a jacket, sunscreen, and water bottle.

PICTURE IT

AM-4DAYS **Week 3** **\$40**

Grades 4-12. This camp will focus on having fun while we experiment with taking digital pictures. Campers will learn about basic photography skills: composing a shot, filling the frame, and finding a point of interest. Campers will have the opportunity to publically display some of their pictures from the week at Security 1st Bank in Hay Springs. Campers are encouraged to bring their own digital cameras with USB cords, however there will be cameras available.

RESCUE 911

AM-4DAYS **Week 3** **\$40**

Grades 1-2. This camp is an age appropriate introduction to stranger danger, bullying, gun safety, fire safety, and drug prevention. There will be several activities throughout the week including a drill which will begin with kid appropri-

ate situations, deciding when/if to call 911, placing the call, help arriving, and discussion. Campers need to be sure to wear comfortable walking shoes—no flip-flops, and bring sunscreen, jacket, and water bottle.

SAFETY 911

AM-4DAYS **Week 4** **\$40**

Grades PK-1. This camp is a fun, age appropriate introduction to safety. This camp will include rules of the road, bicycle/walking safety, fire safety, drug prevention, emergency response, and other important safety tips. There will be several fun activities throughout the week: fingerprinting, fire truck, ambulance, and cop car tours, and a walk-about observing rules of the road. Campers need to be sure to wear comfortable walking shoes—no flip-flops, and bring sunscreen, jacket, and water bottle.

SCIENCE IS MAGIC

AM-4DAYS **Week 4** **\$40**

Grades 2-5. The magic of science will be explored through demonstrations and hands-on experiments. Campers will make Hydrogen and Oxygen, explode eggs, test household chemicals with pH paper and universal pH solution, and construct and fire an alcohol cannon, and more! All necessary supplies and equipment will be provided.

SWING CHOIR

AM-4DAYS **Week 3** **\$40**

Grades 3-5. A part of each day will be spent learning songs, including parts singing and learning choreography. By the end of the week, we will have put together the songs, choreography,

and perform a show for the public. We may also walk over to the Pioneer Manor for a performance. All campers need to bring is their jazz hands, a smile, and a positive attitude.

THEATRE CAMP

PM-3DAYS **Week 3** **\$30**

Grades 3-8. In this three day camp the campers will be learning all facets of theatre. We will start the first day by learning a bit about the history of the theater and also learn our stage directions and all parts of the theater including the technical assets. Also, on the first day we will discuss what creates a play. We will begin work on creating a short show that will be performed on the third day. The second day will involve using our playwriting skills to create our short play. And on the third day we will rehearse for the play. We will invite all the campers' families and any community members interested in seeing the short play. On all three days we will be playing theatre games that are fun and help with learning different skills needed when acting. The camp will focus on introductory skills into acting. If the campers come ready to have fun and ready to use their imaginations they are already set into becoming a thespian!!

VOLLEYBALL

PM-4DAYS **Week 1** **\$40**

Grades 4-8. This camp will focus on fundamental skills in volleyball. Hitting, serving, teamwork, rules of the game and beginning strategy will be the emphasis for the week. Campers should wear gym clothes and bring clean tennis shoes to wear on the Lister-Sage gym floor.

Helpful Hints

The helpful hints are written to be a general rule for all camps and campers. When necessary more detailed information has been included in the camp description.

Who Can Attend?

The camps are open to all children from any school, any town.

Cost

The cost of each camp is listed in the description as well as the summer camp overview. Generally the prices are set at \$10/half-day and \$15/full-day.

Registration

Registration will remain open throughout the camps. Those who register and pay by May 24th will save \$5 per camp. As most camps fill quickly, we encourage you to register as early as possible. Camp enrollment is first come, first serve.

Payment

Cash will be accepted however, we prefer checks or money orders. Please make payable to: HSPS Summer Camps. You may combine payments for multiple registrations. Payment must be received prior to your child attending camp.

Camp Confirmation

You will receive a confirmation of your camp registration. Our preferred method of contact will be via email—when not applicable, you will be notified by other means.

Supervision/Behavior

Summer camp safety is our top priority. School administration will be on campus. Adult supervision as well as pre-screened camp volunteers will be present during each camp session. Students are expected to behave in a safe and respectful manner. If behavior becomes an issue, the parent or designated emergency contact will be expected to remove the child. Inappropriate behavior may result in suspension from further camp activities/sessions.

What to Wear

Wear clothing and shoes that are comfortable and appropriate for both inside and outside activity. A light jacket is encouraged. Please no flip-flops.

Snack

Small snacks will be provided. Water bottles are encouraged.

Lunch

As part of our Summer Lunch program this year, lunch will be available from 12:00 to 12:30 pm for children in summer camps.

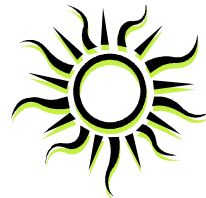

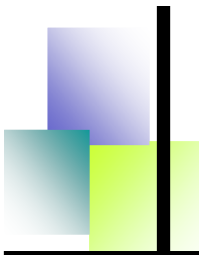
