I would like to thank the parents, students, and staff members for their dedication and effort in preparing for state assessments this year!

During the month of July the school will be replacing part of the roof on the high school. This is the final section of the roof that needs to be replaced. The roof project is scheduled to take place from July 5-July 15.

Assessment News

For teachers, thoughts of spring bring with them thoughts of testing. While testing does take time from classroom instruction, it can also be a valuable tool for teachers and parents. It allows them to see student progress, strengths, and weaknesses. It also helps teachers make instructional decisions for individual students and the whole class. Besides, it's required by law whether we like it or not.

Students in grades 4, 8, and 11 took the Statewide-writing assessment the end of January or beginning of February. This is a writing

assessment that measures student performance on state writing standards. It is given every winter.

Students in grades 2-11 took the NWEA MAPS assessments in March. These are computerized assessments in reading, math, language, and science. Teachers should have shared the available results at Parent Teacher Conferences.

The legislature has also required that we start giving a state test in the areas of reading, math, and science. The reading test (NeSA-R) is required for students in grades 3 through 8 and 11. It tests vocabulary and comprehension and is an on-line assessment. This is now a three day test, with the addition of new items, which may include some writing. We are planning to begin with NeSA testing the week of March 28th. Students will also be taking the state math test (NeSA-M) and the state science test (NeSA-S). You will receive results from all of these tests in the fall.

Elementary students were benchmarked this fall and winter using AIMSweb fluency & comprehension and AIMSweb math. They will be benchmarked for spring before school is out.

Your child's teacher should notify them of an impending test. You can help your child by remembering it is important for him/her to get a good night's sleep before testing and to eat a good breakfast. Also remind your child that these tests are important and encourage him/her to do their best.

Chromebooks

As the school continues to provide laptops to each student 6th through 12th grade, the nature of the computers provided continues to evolve. While in the past Windows laptops were provided, we are moving to Chromebooks for the upcoming sixth graders. In addition to being much more affordable (the computer itself costing much less plus they don't require additional software, such as MS Office), they also have excellent battery life and are smaller and lighter while still able to do everything a student at Hay Springs Public School needs.

The one thing they are not able to do is run MS Office. Instead they will have Google Docs which has many benefits over MS Office and all the functionality needed for school work. The school is in the process of migrating toward Google Apps for Education, which provides email, personal websites, calendar services and Google Docs, and the Chrome Books will help speed this migration. Google Apps for Education is free to the school as opposed to the very expensive MS Office. The change will be a bit of a learning curve, but different doesn't mean bad.

It's beginning to look like spring and yes, our students are ready! Spring brings about playing outside with friends, nice weather, and struggling to do homework when it's so nice outside. All this spring talk brings about how to handle our emotions and the types of emotions one experiences. Kindergarten through eighth grade have been learning about emotions and how to communicate their emotions. Using the Disney movie *Inside Out*, students are learning about five emotions: anger; disgust; fear; sadness; and joy. *Inside Out* is a research based movie which took Disney five years to make and students of all ages are enjoying the activities. If students and or parents have not watched *Inside Out*, I would highly recommend it. As *Inside Out* director stated, "this film was really born from watching our kids grow up, which is not easy." Beginning March 30, 2016 grades 5-8 will begin *Real Colors*. - * Notify other schools of your decision

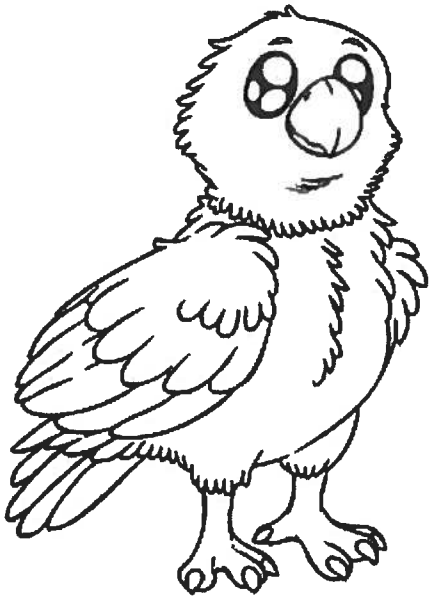
