# **Day Camp Descriptions**

## AM-4DAYS

## ANIMAL PLANET Week 4

\$20

Grades PK-K. This camp will be a very general exploration of the life and parts of common insects: lady bugs, grasshoppers, butterflies, bees and wasps, as well as other bugs that campers find in the pitfall traps that they will make. Campers will learn bug songs, make bug crafts and will also get to watch the movie "A Bug's Life".

#### <u>A BUG'S LIFE II</u> Week 2

\$20

Grades 1-3. This camp will be a more in depth exploration of the life and parts of common insects: lady bugs, grasshoppers, butterflies, bees and wasps, as well as other bugs that campers find in the pitfall traps that they will make. ## Who Can Attend?

## <u>Cost</u>

The cost of each camp is listed in the description as well as the summer camp overview. Generally the prices are set at \$20 a camper/ per camp.

## **Registration**

Registration will remain open throughout

the camps. Those who register and pay by May 22 will save <u>\$5 per camper</u>. As some camps may fill quickly, we encourage you to register as early as possible. Camp enrollment is first come, first serve upon full payment.

## <u>Payment</u>

Cash will be accepted however, we prefer checks or money orders. Please make payable to: HSPS Summer Camps. You may combine payments for multiple registrations.

## Camp Confirmation

You will receive a notification if the camp you requested is full or canceled.

## Supervision/Behavior

Summer camp safety is our top priority. School administration will be on campus. Adult supervision as well as pre-screened camp volunteers will be present during each camp session. Students are expected to behave in a safe and respectful manner. If behavior becomes an issue, the parent or designated emergency contact will be expected to remove the child. Inappropriate behavior may result in suspension from further camp activities/sessions.




