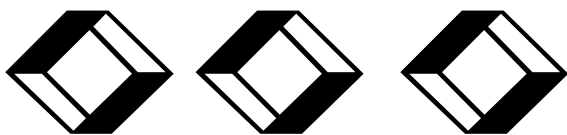
## Welcome

## Day Camp Descriptions

### ANIMAL PLANET

AM-4DAYS

Week 4

\$20

Grades K-1. This camp will focus on: farm animals, zoo animals, and sea animals. Campers will have the opportunity to watch baby chicks hatch, as well as take a virtual tour or two. Campers need to be sure to wear comfortable walking shoes, sunscreen, jacket, and bring a water bottle.

Campers will learn bug songs, make bug crafts and will also get to watch the movie "A Bug's Life".

### A BUG'S LIFE II

AM-4DAYS

Week 2

Grades 1-3. ### CREATIVE KIDDOS

AM-4DAYS      **Week 3**      \$20

Grades PK-K. During this camp, kiddos will explore the many ways to express themselves creatively through painting, crafts, and play. Note: Kids will get messy and have a great time doing it.

### EXPLORING SCIENCE

AM-4DAYS      **Week 1**      \$20

Grades 1-3. The magic of science will be explored through demonstrations and hands-on experiments. We will be exploring different areas of science: Physics, Chemistry, Biology, and Geology. Campers will make rubber eggs, rockets, and edible rocks, as well as learning how fast things fall. All necessary supplies and equipment will be provided. Campers should wear play clothes—we may get messy.

### FIESTA POCO

AM-4DAYS      **Week 2**      \$20

Grades PK-K. Campers will have the opportunity to taste some traditional Mexican foods, play games, hear music unique to the culture, learn about everyday life, as well as basic words in the Spanish language. All supplies and equipment will be provided.

### FOOD AROUND THE WORLD

SP-4DAYS      **Week 1**      \$20

Grades 4-8. \*\*1:00pm to 3:00pm\*\* We will be cooking food from all around the world. We will be cooking food from Mexico, China, Italy and Australia and learning a little geography and history along the way. The recipes are simple enough for kids to cook and share with their parents. All supplies and equipment will be provided.

### GEAR TECH

SP-4DAYS      **Week 1**      \$30

Grades 3-8. \*\*ALL DAY—8:30 to 3:30\*\* GEAR-Tech-21 teaches robotics, GPS, and GIS technologies through building and programming a robot, navigation, and mapmaking activities.

### LEGO COMMUNITY

**AM-4DAYS** **Week 2** **\$20**

Grades 1-3. Campers will work to build common community buildings/businesses using Legos®. The importance of community will be discussed and mini-field trips to local buildings will be taken. All supplies and equipment will be provided.

### MY MODEL CAR

**AM-4DAYS** **Week 4** **\$20**

Grades 3-8. My model car camp will introduce participants to the basics of plastic model kit completion. Campers will have a choice of '70 Ford Mustang or a '71 Plymouth GTX to build. Campers will be using paint and model glue so plan clothing accordingly. All necessary supplies will be provided.

### A PIECE OF CAKE

**AM-4DAYS** **Week 3** **\$20**

Grades 3-12. During this camp, campers will learn to make and use fondant and frosting to decorate their cakes. Campers will work as a team to create a mural made of different types of cakes using various tools, tips, and techniques.

### PRESCHOOL CAMP OUT

**AM-4DAYS** **Week 4** **\$20**

Grades PK. This camp is designed for preschool children ages 3 and up who are toilet-

trained and have not yet attended Kindergarten. Come join us on our Preschool Camp Out! We will explore and do fun activities to promote social skills and early learning skills.

### SIMPLE CRAFTS

**AM-4DAYS** **Week 4** **\$20**

Grades 3-8. This camp will focus on easy-to-do home décor crafts. Campers will create a memo board and other fun and useful household crafts. All necessary supplies will be provided.

### STAINED GLASS

**AM-4DAYS** **Week 3** **\$20**

Grades 4-12. This camp is designed for those with the desire to learn the basics of stained glass design. participants will be introduced to the basic stained glass terminology and skills: glass safety, preparing a project pattern, scoring and breaking out of stained glass, making a jig, grinding cut glass pieces to fit the pattern being used and to remove sharp edges, washing the glass pieces, wrapping glass pieces in copper foil, soldering the pieces together and cleaning/polishing the project. All necessary supplies will be provided.

### VOLLEYBALL

Grades 4-6. This camp is designed to teach and review the fundamentals of volleyball: passing, serving, setting, bumping, and game play.

Who Can Attend?

Cost

The cost of each camp is listed in the description as well as the summer camp overview. Generally the prices are set at \$20 a camper/ per camp.

Registration

Registration will remain open throughout

the camps. Those who register and pay by May 22 will save \$5 per camper. As some camps may fill quickly, we encourage you to register as early as possible. Camp enrollment is first come, first serve upon full payment.

Payment

Cash will be accepted however, we prefer checks or money orders. Please make payable to: HSPS Summer Camps. You may combine payments for multiple registrations.

Camp Confirmation

You will receive a notification if the camp you requested is full or canceled.

Supervision/Behavior

Summer camp safety is our top priority. School administration will be on campus. Adult supervision as well as pre-screened camp volunteers will be present during each camp session. Students are expected to behave in a safe and respectful manner. If behavior becomes an issue, the parent or designated emergency contact will be expected to remove the child. Inappropriate behavior may result in suspension from further camp activities/sessions.

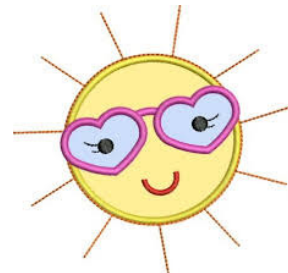

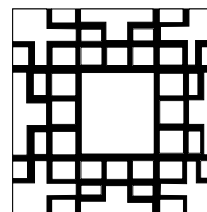
