The theme of the week was N is for numbers. We explored numbers 1-10 but mainly focused on numbers 1 and 2. Ms. Wiepen also made a new game for us to play. It is called, "Don't get zapped." We have to draw a popsicle stick out of the jar and then count the dots and read the number on the stick.

If we are right we get to keep it. If we are wrong we count the dots as a class and the stick goes back into the jar. There are some sticks that say, "Zapped!" If we pull one of those out we have to put all of our sticks back in. When the time runs out whoever has the most sticks is the winner. This game is a big hit in the classroom and is asked for everyday!!! We get a lot of good practice learning to count with this game!
