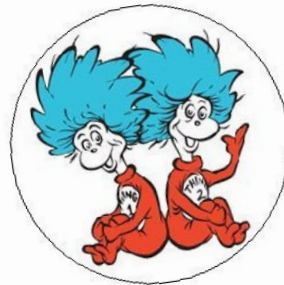
We read books about going to the dentist, looked at posters of the proper ways to brush our teeth and we even
