Winter officially does not start until December 22nd but with the cold weather, snow, and more snow coming the most common question from students is, "are we having school tomorrow?" So in an effort to clarify our winter procedures please read the following.

School Closing/Late Start Announcements: When snow, ice, or poor driving conditions are predicted it is our intent to make the decision to close school or start late, as early as possible. When the school decision is made the first place we post the information is the school district's website (www.hshawks.com). Then we will post the announcement on our Facebook Page, www. chadrad.com, and send out a text alert from Remind 101. If school is cancelled during the day, parents will be notified.

Parents may decide to keep their children at home in inclement weather because of personal circumstances. Students absent because of severe weather when school is in session will be marked absent. The absence will be treated like any other absence for legitimate causes provided parents properly notify the school of their decision. Parents may pick up their children in inclement weather at any time during the school day. Students may be dismissed from school during the severe weather with a telephone request from the parents.

<u>Dress appropriately for winter weather:</u> It is suggested that students dress in layers to allow them to take off a layer if they get too hot or add a layer if they get to cold. The school buildings tend to get a little drafty on windy days.

Elementary students will not be allowed to go out to recess without appropriate winter clothes as determined by the playground monitor. Students who wish to play in the snow must wear boots, snow pants, and gloves.

<u>Christmas Vacation:</u> Students will be dismissed for Christmas vacation at the end of the day on Tuesday, December 22^{nd} and return to school on Monday, January 4^{th} . During the vacation encourage your children to read while they are home during this time.

End of Second Quarter/First Semester: The end of the second quarter/first semester is December 23rd. Students must have all assignments turned in at the end of the day on December 22rd. Students' report cards will be available after Christmas vacation.




